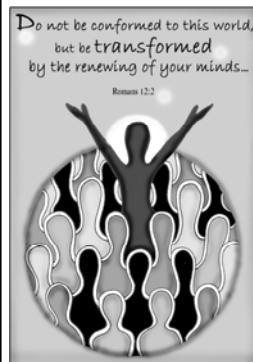

The mission of the Nebraska District is to resource congregations, leaders, and related organizations in their mission of discipling the saved and proclaiming Christ to a lost and changing world.

**BOARD SUMMARY** . . . The Nebraska District Board of Directors took the following action at its December 11 meeting:

- Approved constitution and bylaw revisions for the following congregations: The Rock, Seward; Trinity, Madison; Faith, Hastings; and Zion, Harbine.
- Accepted the action taken by the Lutheran Church Extension Fund Nebraska Program for Messiah, Lincoln, and Mount Calvary, Omaha.
- Affirmed the housing allowance resolution for Minister of the Gospel employees of the Nebraska District.
- Ratified the 2010 District participation plan for Concordia Health Plans worker choice options.
- Authorized the lease of the District-owned property at 44<sup>th</sup> Street and Grover in Omaha (formerly Zion+Peace Lutheran Church) to Beautiful Savior, LaVista, to initiate a satellite ministry.
- Approved a 2010 capital budget of \$45,100.
- Approved the 2010 Nebraska District mission and ministry operating expense budget of \$3,979,610, a reduction of \$292,569 from the 2009 budget. Reductions included no staff compensation increases, reduction of three full-time District staff to part-time, and reduction of Synod support by \$138,000.
- Approved a District-wide appeal for gifts by Issues, Etc. Radio in May 2010 to fulfill the 2009 District Convention resolution to encourage District congregations to consider financial and other support for this program.
- Considered the New Mission Start Committee recommendations for grant funding for Lamb of God, Omaha, and Word of Life, Lincoln, and provided reduced new mission grant support in accordance with the decreased financial support from District congregations.
- Conducted board development in-service on Synod and state-required service, elective ministry services, and District partnerships.
