Presentations

Thursday

Carrie Gottschalk has spent 25 years in the fields of education and mental and behavioral health working with children, adolescents and families. In her current role as an educator with Nebraska Extension, Carrie is dedicated to providing research-informed practices to parents, providers and professionals working with children. The first session, From Bully to Buddy will provide insights into answering “What makes a bully?” as well as provide strategies for successfully intervening and shaping a bully’s behaviors. Session 2, PBIS, will discuss Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports, classroom-wide and program-wide framework for promoting positive social-emotional development of all children.

*Early Childhood Directors will meet separately from school administrators on Thursday after lunch. Lynn Vollbracht will present Ethics and the Early Childhood Educator. This session will introduce the NAEYC Code of Ethical Conduct, which was written to provide guidance for understanding and working with difficult ethical issues in early childhood education.

Aaron Parker will meet with school administrators to discuss updates from Atlas Rubicon. He will review how lesson planning will fit into the bigger picture of unit planning and curriculum, tour the new lesson planning feature in Atlas, and share tips and tricks for adding your lessons.

Rev. Nathan Sherrill and Rev. Timothy Frank of St. Paul’s Music Conservatory, Council Bluffs, IA will share the need for ministry revitalization within many of our Lutheran Schools. Together they will explain how their upcoming RSO, “The Center for Music Development,” can help maximize the potential of our schools’ music departments. Emphasis will be placed on programming support and strategic planning with goals of increased enrollment, community engagement and gospel proclamation.

Mitchell Germain, founder and CEO at ZingApps.com will share information about how schools can make the most of current technologies to reach today’s hyper-connected and smartphone-addicted parents.

Friday

Rev. Justin Hannemann, assistant to the District President for Ministerial Health and Executive Director of Grace Point Institute for Relational Health, is a licensed marriage and family therapist. He will cover the topic of social/emotional needs from a scriptural and relational health focus. This session will discuss how we in Lutheran schools can help students form healthy relationships, make smart choices, and take personal accountability for their actions. Topics will include how to boost a child’s ability to build self-confidence, foster acceptance, patience, empathy, and more.

*Early Childhood Directors will meet separately again. Lynn Vollbracht will present Caring Counts. By creating spaces that encourage respect, kindness, and cooperation and by helping to teach children ways to prevent and deal with bullying, you can help children feel comfortable in a caring and welcoming environment. This session will give participants ideas of how to set up the environment, work with families, and get activity ideas to help teach children kindness, respect and cooperation.

Bob Ziegler will cover various topics with school administrators about the District operations and focus for this triennium as part of the District report. Project Compass 3.0 components and the Dunklau grant will be reviewed with progress in the areas of NWEA Map testing, Atlas Rubicon curriculum mapping and the E-rate technology audit process.

*In-service hours will be offered for these ECE sessions.

Lodging

The conference will be held at Carol Joy Holling Conference & Retreat Center. All meeting space will be on the lower level of the Swanson Center. The Thrivent Room will serve as our main meeting space. The Dillon Room, across the hall, will be used when the Early Childhood group meets separately. Meals will be served at the Sjogren Center.

Lodging will be reserved at the Swanson Center and in the Sjogren Center if extra rooms are needed. Standard rooms are double occupancy.
